

# **GETTING TO DARTMOUTH**

Dartmouth is about three hours from Boston and five from New York City. Below, you will find recommended methods of transportation to get to campus.

# AIR TRAVEL

We strongly recommend flying into <u>Boston Logan International Airport (BOS)</u>. Approximately three hours from Hanover, it is the largest airport in the area and offers the most flight options. There is a direct coach service to Hanover through the <u>Dartmouth Coach</u>, making it the easiest option for most participants.

Other nearby airports are Manchester Regional Airport (MHT), approximately two hours from campus, and Lebanon Municipal Airport (LEB), approximately 15 minutes from campus. If you are flying into Manchester, be sure to book a flight that arrives early enough to take the daily <u>Greyhound bus</u> to Hanover that leaves at 2:05 p.m. Likewise, on the final day on campus, plan your return flight based on taking the 1:35 p.m. bus departure from campus.

There is no public transportation from LEB, and it will require a pre-arranged private car service. Local car services include <u>Door-to-Door Driving Services</u> or <u>Grace Limousine</u>. Please note that we have limited Uber and Lyft drivers in the area. We do not recommend relying on them for transportation.

# **DRIVING**

Once here, a car is not necessary for daily transportation, since all activities, shops, and restaurants are within easy walking distance. Unless you are within driving distance of campus, we do not recommend bringing a vehicle to Hanover. If you decide to drive, both hotels offer daily parking at your expense.

There are ChargePoint level 2 electric vehicle (EV) charging stations on the Dartmouth campus for use by visitors and employees. Rates and terms of use are posted at EV charging stalls, with sessions initiated and paid for via the ChargePoint.

Electric vehicle charging station locations:

- Thompson Lot (near the Thompson Arena ice rink)
- Dana Lot (near the Dartmouth Medical School and Anonymous Hall)
- Emily and Errik Anderson Parking Garage (located on the West End of campus at 15 Thayer Drive)

### GROUND TRANSPORTATION

<u>The Dartmouth Coach</u> offers easy and direct service between Boston and Hanover. It stops at both Boston South Station and Boston Logan International Airport, typically once every hour or so. They also offer direct service between New York City and Hanover.

\*Please note that Dartmouth Coach is a private company and not affiliated with Dartmouth College.

<u>Amtrak</u> offers daily service at stops from Washington, DC to nearby White River Junction, VT, on their Vermonter line. There is no public transportation from White River Junction, and it will require a pre-arranged private car service. Local car services include <u>Door-to-Door Driving</u>

<u>Services</u> or <u>Grace Limousine</u>. Please note that we have limited Uber and Lyft drivers in the area. We do not recommend relying on them for transportation.

# **HOTELS**

Hanover has two hotels that are located downtown:

Hanover Inn and Six South Street

The hotel rooms are comfortable and modern, with spaces conducive to study and relaxation. Each room has a private bath.
